Professional Development Committee

However, hope springs eternal and the Pioneers Division along with other CEC members are hopeful of a return to some degree of comradery at the CEC Convention and Expo in Orlando in January 2022 to begin a grand celebration during our 100th year.

There are several activities planned for the convention to highlight CEC history, and there will be a year long series of activities and resources provided by CEC-PD to its members and the entire organization to commemorate the first one hundred years and start on our second century.

For many, history is all about the past and often considered dull and not worth investing time for review, but it can also be alive and a vital part of a successful future. 


Pioneers President's Book Club Fall 2021


